An Acclamation

All: May Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive us our sins, open our eyes to God's truth, strengthen us to do God's will and give us the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Risen Lord. **Amen.**

The opening prayer

All: The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence is kept.

All: As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever. Amen.

The Psalmody Psalm 19

Scripture Reading James 3.1-12

Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. ² For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. ³ If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. ⁴ Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. ⁵ So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits.

How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! ⁶ And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. ⁷ For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, ⁸ but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. ¹⁰ From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. ¹¹ Does a spring pour forth

from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

At the end of the reading we say:

The Gospel Mark 8.27-38

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' ²⁸ And they answered him, 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.' ²⁹ He asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Messiah.' ³⁰ And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days' rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³ But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

³⁴ He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶ For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷ Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸ Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

A Reflection for the day

"For all of us make many mistakes" – what a wonderful thing to hear a leader of the church say! It is easy to judge and forget our common nature before the Almighty.

You wonder what has been happening in the church community for James to write as he has done in his letter so far. At the beginning he reminds folks of the rich blessings they have received from God, of the need to ensure the weakest and neediest are the community's first priority. And now it would seem there have been both hurt filled words used and a lack of grace about how imperfect all people are by nature (even if some feel superior to others)!

The nature of things, especially the nature of a person's heart is the centre of all of James' concerns. St Paul spends many more pages expounding what James brings us in just a few chapters; coming to faith in Christ is a heart and mind, life changing occurrence. For James the proof is really in the pudding; as Jesus said it is not what goes into a man that makes them unclean, but what comes forth from within – the words, the actions, the

passion for justice, righteousness, for grace and for the love of God in the world.

In the gospel today Peter's heart felt realisation about Jesus spills over into words as he declares Jesus is the Messiah. But it is suggested there is some misunderstanding of Messiah on Peter's part, and some blunt words are said. The general hope was for a Messiah who would bring military power and freedom to Israel; like David had done. Jesus instead talks of suffering and of death.

Peter is told guite abruptly not to talk of his realisation; like me, you may find this harsh. James reminds us of the power of the tongue, of a loose tongue especially which can set forth words which will run through a community like a wild fire – and with similar consequences. Rather than run off proclaiming Jesus is Messiah and proclaiming the wrong type of Messiah Peter needed instead to bridle his tongue and listen some more to the words God was speaking in what Jesus would continue to do, and through the cross would shout aloud to the world. The sick are healed, the lame walk, the captive set free, and the year of the Lord's favour is proclaimed. Peter will watch carefully and then his time will come when his tongue will be set free and he will talk of Jesus the Messiah. At that time, rather than destructive fire, peter's words would be filled with the life giving fire of the Holy Spirit; and thousands would come to faith as he had done himself and proclaim Jesus Messiah.

There are good words that can be said and a right time to say them! In between times, like Peter, may we watch for Christ.

The Creed
