Benefice Changes - Deanery Deployment and Pastoral Re-organisation plans for Ivelchester Deanery were agreed at the Wells Archdeaconry Mission and Pastoral Group on 8th November 2023. This means that we can now tell folks that our existing Ilchester Benefice will be 'dissolved' and see the creation of a new benefice comprising Ilchester with Sock Denis and Northover, Limington, Yeovilton with Podimore, Tintinhull, Chilthorne Domer and Yeovil Marsh – to be known as the 'Ivel Meads Benefice'; 'Ivel' after the river and 'Meads' for the meadows of the area. The existing parsonage house (the Rectory) will remain in Ilchester.

This will not be an overnight matter — thankfully! It will take 9 to maybe 18 months of consultations and legal work. During this time we will be able to spend time getting to know our new nieghbours and work on many practical matters behind the scenes.

Please pray for these new relationships, welcome new faces at benefice services and be open to God's presence with us through the changes that will inevitably come along for all.
