Each PCC is looking at a deficit budget this year for the general everyday life of the church (for projects we are able to apply for grants). Fundraising always helps and I am hugely grateful for all folks do to help with this. In recent years we have lost some of our regular givers, moving into care or into God's forever care. In the general every day costs are down to each of us; and yes, the Rector does give every week to each of the PCCs through a direct debit.

One person recently asked me at llchester why the church heating seemed not to work as it used to do. I had to say the PCC used to be able to heat the church over several days in the week, now it is just for the service being held.

To meet the basic costs equates to £20 for each church member, every week across the year. I am aware of the increased life costs all face and that some folks have small incomes and little to give. Please pray about what you might be able to contribute; **your church needs you!**
