An Acclamation

Our Confession

We have lived by our own strength, and not by the power of your resurrection. In your mercy, forgive us, hear us and help us.

We have lived by the light of our own eyes, as faithless and not believing. In your mercy, forgive us, hear us and help us.

We have lived for this world alone, and doubted our home in heaven. In your mercy, forgive us, hear us and help us.

Be still for a moment in confession and in receiving God's Grace in Christ

All: May Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive us our sins, open our eyes to God's truth, strengthen us to do God's will and give us the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Risen Lord. **Amen.**

The opening prayer

All: The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence is kept.

All: As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever. Amen.

Scripture Reading Genesis 3.8-15

They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. ⁹ But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' ¹⁰ He said, 'I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.' ¹¹ He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' ¹² The man said, 'The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.' ¹³ Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.' ¹⁴ The Lord God said to the serpent,

'Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life.

¹⁵I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.'

The Gospel Mark 3.2035

Then he (Jesus) went home; ²⁰ and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹ When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' ²² And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' ²³ And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. ²⁷ But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

²⁸ 'Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin'— ³⁰ for they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.'

³¹ Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. ³² A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers and sisters^[c] are outside, asking for you.' ³³ And he replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' ³⁴ And looking at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.'

A Reflection for the day

'Fact Checking' is the watch word of the moment. Be it in relation to international affairs, especially where Russia is concerned, or national matters during an election campaign, the true fact matter.

St Paul reminds us of the hidden agendas, the unseen forces that sway human thinking, personal or corporately. He calls these 'principalities and powers at work in the world', today we might call them 'spin', advertisers, 'social influencers' or even AI (artificial intelligence). In the Garden of Eden, a hidden persuasive force is at work, tempting, leading humanity away from God's purposes; with one bite all seems to come tumbling down.

During Jesus' ministry whatever forces were at work they have become vocalised in the work of the Pharisees and Herodians that opposed his growing ministry and message. No one would accept Jesus' ministry if they thought he was a mad man, more so if they could be persuaded the force behind his actions was the devil itself; the one since Eden always leading God's people in the wrong direction. The stories, the spin they told, seem to have worked, for we see even his mother and brothers are worried and concerned and have come to draw him back from the work he is focussed on.

Whichever is the reality, Jesus says there should be rejoicing. If he is operating in the 'power of Beelzebul' then it is good news for this would mean warfare amongst the ranks of the enemies of God and His people. This would result in their destruction and the liberation of humanity – good news! If he instead is of God and his works reveal the power of God victorious over the enemies of God, then again this is good news. For God is on the march, the longed for deliverance of God's people is at hand – good news!

As those who dwell on the other side of the events of Easter we know that it is the latter, Jesus is God's agent of redemption, as the Christ he is the deliverer of the universe from the powers of sin and death – Good News!

The words of Jesus to the crowd, seemingly rejecting his familial ties, seem harsh and we have an empathy for them all; especially Mary. But I wonder if Mary felt rejected or again caught a glimpse of the promises declared to her about the child she bore. The promise that he would redeem all of Israel, that through him all would be, at last, the family of Abraham, descendants too numerous to count, yet having one familial heritage. And more, I wonder if Mary glimpsed that all who would undertake the will of God, be they Jew or Gentile, would be the

promised people, the family of God. It is all too easy to define peoples by labels, be those names, colour, or nationalities. Jesus suggests there is only one trait that reveals familial identity, actively undertaking the will of God. The key is whether there is a familial resemblance to brother Jesus, living as he does in the loving purposes of God - bringing justice, mercy, healing, peace and reconciliation to the world. These are the 'facts' we should be looking for, checking up on.

The Creed
