An Acclamation

Our Confession

We have lived by the light of our own eyes, as faithless and not believing. In your mercy, forgive us, hear us and help us.

We have lived for this world alone, and doubted our home in heaven. In your mercy, forgive us, hear us and help us.

Be still for a moment in confession and in receiving God's Grace in Christ

All: May Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive us our sins, open our eyes to God's truth, strengthen us to do God's will and give us the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Risen Lord. **Amen.**

The opening prayer

All: The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence is kept.

All: As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever. Amen.

Save me, O God, by your name and vindicate me by your power.

Scripture Reading Jeremiah 11.18-20

It was the Lord who made it known to me, and I knew;

then you showed me their evil deeds.

¹⁹ But I was like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter.

And I did not know it was against me that they devised schemes, saying,

'Let us destroy the tree with its fruit,

let us cut him off from the land of the living,

so that his name will no longer be remembered!'

²⁰ But you, O Lord of hosts, who judge righteously,

who try the heart and the mind, let me see your retribution upon them,

for to you I have committed my cause.

The Gospel Mark 9.30-37

They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; ³¹ for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, 'The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again.' ³² But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

³³ Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the way?' ³⁴ But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest. ³⁵ He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.' ³⁶ Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷ 'Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'

at the end of the reading we say:

All: This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

A Reflection for the day

Last week the question was posed in Mark's Gospel, 'who do the people say that I am'? One of the answers given was 'Elijah the prophet'. Were they really saying he was Elijah come back to life or re-incarnated, I suspect not! What they were most likely saying was Jesus is acting, speaking and living like the greatest of our prophets (Islam today hold that Jesus was a great prophet and little else).

Peter, however declares Jesus is the Messiah of God and therefore something very much more than a prophet, very much more than the figure of Moses (the law bringer; God is the Law giver) also mentioned as in the previous verses in Mark. Jesus is more than the law bringer, much more than the prophets – as Messiah he will fulfil all the law and the prophets; he completes their works as he brings everyone into a new reality; the way of the Messiah.

The prophets had an interesting time of things, often a costly and pain filled ministry – Jeremiah's was especially so! He ministered in the time running up to the first destruction of Jerusalem and his words were filled with judgment and lament. In the reading we have to day Jeremiah is filled with lament for Jerusalem and, in true prophetic style he begins to suggest the option for God now is judgement. Here is the difference between the prophet and God's Messiah, as Jesus laments he refuses judgement.

More so, rather than call for judgement through which Israel, the lamb facing slaughter, would be delivered from her enemies, Jesus talks of the need for God's Messiah to become like a lamb and to be 'slaughtered', to be offered as a sacrifice for sin, to suffer, die and to then rise once more. Rather than call down fire and judgement and see deliverance, Jesus instead prays from the cross 'Father, forgive them; they know not what they are doing'.

Prophet and Messiah are both faithful in their calling; they live out the message they bring. For the prophet this is lament and a cry for judgement, for the Messiah it is lament for sin and separation from the love of God and a cry for forgiveness – Jesus is indeed very much more, very much greater than the prophets!

Jesus then embodies, not judgement but the love and forgiveness of God and challenges his followers to act in the same manner in life. The disciples' argument over who is the greatest is in its simplest form them seeking to set in place a level of judgement, a 'bar' for acceptance. Jesus turns to someone society judged to have no status and few rights and says, 'if you want a bench mark for how God looks upon the world and considers things, here you are'. God welcomes those in society below any measure of what it is to be acceptable, lovable, valued, of greatness – and so it is for his followers!

The Creed

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
